Our Academies

INDEPENDENT STUDY

GRADES: 9-12

Students learn online without the peer pressure and rigid schedules found in traditional public schools. Students receive a free Chromebook to complete their work and meet with their teacher regularly in a public place, like a library or coffee shop. This flexible program allows students to work, catch up on credits and earn their diploma from home without the drama.

UNIVERSITY PREP
