Public School At Home

Visions is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Our students and families enjoy a variety of extra benefits that aren't available at traditional public schools.



Our Programs



Independent Study

GRADES: 9-12

Students receive a free Chromebook to complete their work online and virtually meet with their teacher. This flexible program allows students to work, catch up on credits and earn their diploma safely from home. Students receive a budget of \$1,500 for activities, projects and community college materials. This program offers students maximum flexibilty and support in their education.

University Prep Early College

GRADES: 9-12

This academy focuses on A-G honors classes to prepare students for college or university. We offer three distinct pathways, Associate Degree (AA Degree), certificates, and A-G completion, through our Early College program which combines high school courses with college courses. Students meet with their teacher one-on-one and in small groups with other students. A free Chromebook is provided so students can complete their courses online from home. Students receive a budget of \$1,500 for activities, projects and community college materials.

Home School

GRADES: TK-8

Teachers partner with parents to provide an excellent home school education. Students in grades TK-8 are provided \$3,000. This instructional resources budget is used for approved curriculum, enrichment activities and materials so families can customize their child's education. Parent partners provide four to six hours of daily instruction and receive support from a credentialed teacher.

Online Middle School - New for 24/25

GRADES: 7&8

Students are provided a free Chromebook and core classes are taught live online by credentialed teachers. This academy includes an organized daily schedule to keep students on track and regular updates are provided to parents/guardians. Students receive a budget of \$1,500 for activities and extracurriculars. This program is different from our Home School Academy as the parent/guardian is not responsible for daily instruction as it is provided by Visions teachers.



Support Services

Learning at home doesn't mean missing out on dances, clubs, in-person events, field trips or community college. At Visions, the extra flexibility in your schedule gives you more time to expand your education!

Student Clubs

We have over 50 clubs for students of all ages to choose from. We have something for everyone, including art, soccer, Black Student Union, basketball and more!

Visions In Education focuses on the wellbeing of our students. Not only do we provide a personalized education but we also offer services to help students manage their mental health.

Services

Visions is partnered with Care Solace, a free online coordination tool that connects students and families with mental health services in their community.



Supportive Staff

We have a full team of 15 counselors. 5 social workers and a Foster and Homeless Liaison to support our community. This team also organizes online classes and workshops.

Resources

Students have access to tons of digital wellness resources on topics like coping skills, personal growth, dealing with crises and more. Visions also offers a "mobile library" that is brought to our in-person events and a "virtual calming room".
